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Passing Standard

The learner to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination. The learner shall obtain minimum 40% marks (i.e., 08 out of 20) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e., 12 out of 30) separately to pass the course and minimum of Grade P in each project, whenever applicable to pass a particular semester. A learner will be said to have passed the course if the learner passes the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination together.
